**4. Build an aqueduct** • Download the Build with Roman Arches worksheet ([www.jaconline.com.au/atlasofdiscovery/links/learningcentres.html](http://www.jaconline.com.au/atlasofdiscovery/links/learningcentres.html)) and follow the instructions to construct an aqueduct used by ancient Romans to move water. **Four points**



**5. **6. Prepare a Europe borders map** • Download a political map of Europe ([www.jaconline.com.au/atlasofdiscovery/links/mapmasters.html](http://www.jaconline.com.au/atlasofdiscovery/links/mapmasters.html)) and colour the borders of the country according to what has been used to define it, such as a river, mountain range, lake, sea or simply an agreed line. Be sure to provide a key for your map. The maps of Europe from pages 134–143 of the *Atlas of Discovery* will help you identify the borders. **Five points**



**7. Prepare a PowerPoint awards ceremony** • Select and research a series of world record holders that have either helped movement or stopped it. Some examples are bridges, walls and tunnels. Prepare a PowerPoint presentation in the style of the Academy Awards, where you award each one a prize for categories such as 'longest undersea tunnel' or 'longest fence in the world' (see page 36 of the *Atlas of Discovery* for further suggestions). Be sure to add details about each feature that relate to the prize you award it. **Seven points**



**8. Prepare an issues investigation** • Page 36 of the *Atlas of Discovery* shows an example of a razor wire fence separating Israelis and Palestinians. Prepare a 500-word report that outlines why there is a dispute between these two groups. Include maps to show how this region of the Middle East has changed, and use the Internet and newspapers to find out the most recent attempts to resolve the problem. **Seven points**
