1. Answer Challenge questions • Answer all Challenge questions from Terrorism — page 41 of the *Atlas of Discovery*.

2. Prepare a graph • Prepare a graph to represent the world's worst terrorist attacks (shown on page 40 of the *Atlas of Discovery*).

3. Create a newspaper article • Create the front page of a newspaper reporting the terrorist bombing in Bali in 2002. Research and record what happened, including the destruction, the injuries and deaths, who was responsible and why, and the impact on the local people and the families and friends of the victims.

4. Demonstrate self defence • Prepare a demonstration of self-defence moves that could be used to disarm or escape an attacker. Devise a series of simple moves to use with beginners and perform these with the class.

5. Write a song or poem • Following the terrorist attacks on America in 2001 (see pages 40–41 of the *Atlas of Discovery*), many artists expressed the shock, grief and anger they felt over the attacks. Prepare your own song, poem or artwork to express how you feel about the attack on America, the Bali bombing or another terrorist attack.

6. Write a story • A fourth plane failed to reach its target in the terrorist attacks on America of September 11, 2001 (see pages 40–41 of the *Atlas of Discovery*). Passengers on board overpowered the terrorists and forced the plane to crash before it reached Washington DC. Everyone on board was killed, but many more would have died if the plane had reached its target. Many passengers had time to phone their loved ones when they realised their fate. Imagine you were on this flight. Write a story of between 500 and 750 words that captures the incredibly tense situation the passengers found themselves in.

7. Design a memorial • Look carefully at the site of 'Ground Zero' on page 41 of the *Atlas of Discovery*. Using the scale, prepare a map and sketch of a memorial to be built on the site. Use the Internet to view other pictures of the site.

8. Prepare an issues investigation • Page 36 of the *Atlas of Discovery* shows an example of a razor wire fence separating Israelis from Palestinian suicide bombers. Prepare a 500-word report that outlines why there is a dispute between the two parties. Include maps to show how this region of the Middle East has changed and use the Internet and newspapers to find out the most recent attempts to resolve the problem.
