- 1: Top-left corner, 4 squares across.
- 2: Second row, fifth column, 4 squares down.
- 3: Third row, fourth column, 4 squares across.
- 4: Fourth row, first column, 7 squares across.
- 5: Fourth row, eighth column, 4 squares down.
- 6: Sixth row, first column, 4 squares across.
- 7: Sixth row, third column, 4 squares across.
- 8: Eighth row, eighth column, 6 squares down.
- 9: Ninth row, first column, 4 squares across.
- 10: Tenth row, seventh column, 4 squares down.
- 11: Eleventh row, second column, 7 squares across.
- 12: Twelfth row, sixth column, 5 squares across.
- 13: Thirteenth row, first column, 4 squares across.
